## BRONX TEACHER HEADING TO SHAKESPEARE'S GLOBE IN LONDON!



**Congratulations to Elyse Lewis,** recipient of the ESU NYC Branch 2024 TLab Scholarship to attend the "Teaching Shakespeare Through Performance" course at Shakespeare's Clobe in London, June 24 - July 12th surrounded by artists, educators, and professionals from around the world. Elyse shares:

I am thrilled to represent the NYC Branch of the ESU in London this summer. It will be an honor to study Shakespeare's work right where it first began. The power of theatre is at the root of my teaching at the Bronx Center for Science and Mathematics. Our school community brings together students of a large range of ethnicities, racial and cultural backgrounds, home languages, religions, and immigrant experiences. Many of my students have no prior experience with theatre or live performance. They are often skeptical of classical texts at first but are always quickly taken by storm by the magic of Shakespeare or the Ancient Greeks. My students often struggle with the language of Shakespeare - especially the English Language Learners (ELLs) and students with special needs. My studies in Shakespeare have been primarily through an English Literature lens. I can't wait to dive deeper into teaching Shakespeare in order to elevate and expand my curriculum and unlock the magic of the Bard for my students and school community when I return to the Bronx this fall.
