

Kennedy Williams ESU 2024-25 Luard Morse Scholar, has had an enriching experience this summer as a research intern at the National Institutes of Environmental Health Sciences in the Research Triangle, NC. Kennedy recently shared, " I had the privilege of conducting research in the Social and Environmental Determinants of Health Equity lab.

My primary project involved conducting a comprehensive literature review on "Occupational Prestige in relation to sleep health among the Study of Environmental Lifestyle & Fibroids cohort," as well as estimating participant characteristics based on occupational prestige scores using preliminary SELF data. Through this work, I gained valuable insights into epidemiology and its critical role in public health. I delved deeply into the literature, uncovering significant health disparities affecting minority populations, particularly in relation to sleep health. Additionally, I had the opportunity to expand my skills in data analysis and coding using large datasets. I also showcased my findings through presentations during the Summer Communication Challenge, as well as at both the NIEHs Epidemiology Science Day and the NIH Summer Poster Day."

Kennedy is about to begin her Junior Year as a biology major at North Carolina A&T State University. She is looking forward to continuing her studies at Kings College London Winter/Spring Semester as an ESU Luard Morse Scholar.

Since 1969, The English-Speaking Union has provided Luard Morse Scholarships to students attending historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) to study in the United Kingdom.
