It empowers our network to expand programs, enhance mentorship, and launch initiatives. In this way, we foster lifelong learning and connection, fueling individual, branch and organizational growth. Through our collective effort, we can continue to open doors of opportunity for individuals eager to learn and connect through the power of the English language.

The 2025 Founder's Award – Announcing the ESU Capacity Building Campaign

The ESU Capacity-Building Campaign launched at the 2025 Founder's Award Gala will support the financial strength of the English-Speaking Union of the United States. Sustaining this 105-year-old nonprofit organization requires an expanded endowment, and increased funding to continue the provision of international and cultural education, scholarships for students and teachers, and language and job preparedness programs for new arrivals to the United States. The Campaign will also bring new resources to support a strong Branch system for local, regional, and national impact. The Campaign's goals, naming



opportunities, and case for support are being developed in collaboration with the English-Speaking Union's stakeholders through a campaign feasibility study. This significant fundraising effort will coincide with the celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the historic National Headquarters building in 2026.

Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Dr. E Quinn Peeper

2025 Honoree: Dr. Earl Quinn Peeper

Dr. Earl Quinn Peeper is a Board Certified Physician of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the New Orleans Touro Infirmary, Fellow of the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and His Britannic Majesty's Honorary Consul to New Orleans.

Since joining the New Orleans Branch in 1994, Dr. Peeper's dedication to the ESU is exemplified by his rise from Local Board Member to New Orleans Branch President, and ultimately to his roles as National Board Member, President and National Chair. He is the



first Founder's Award recipient to have risen through the ranks of the ESU Branch system and his steadfast commitment to advancing the ESU's mission at local and national levels while cultivating international understanding and goodwill make him an exemplary choice for this honor.

As President of the ESU New Orleans Branch, Dr. Peeper significantly enhanced the Branch's international, national, educational, and cultural exchange programs with Great Britain. In 1999, he founded the first Shakespeare Competition in New Orleans, affiliating it with the Tulane Shakespeare Festival. His love for British culture also led him to organize the first New Orleans ESU Patron Tour in 2000, which became a beloved annual event, along with the Shakespeare Competition, lecture series, and the Queen's Birthday Jazz Brunch.

Dr. Peeper's leadership was crucial during the challenging aftermath of Hurricane Katrina in 2005. He sought help from the ESU Memphis Branch, which graciously welcomed displaced New Orleanians.

Once the city reopened, Dr. Peeper organized several initiatives to rebuild the community, including an English-in-Action program for Vietnamese immigrants in New Orleans East and a successful fundraising weekend symposium on British Historic Homes and Gardens. In 2008, just three years after Katrina, he brought the ESU Annual General Meeting to New Orleans to support local recovery efforts and strengthen the bonds between the local community and ESU members nationwide.

In 2008, Dr. Peeper joined the National ESU Board of Directors, where he



served on numerous committees and co-founded the ESU Legacy Society, which supports estate planning for the organization. His contributions to the ESU's immigrant services were also significant, leading to the establishment of the Andrew Romay New Immigrant Center. In 2014, Dr. Peeper was elected President of National ESU, where he led a successful fundraising campaign and organized events such as the centenary gala in New Orleans.

In 2021, he was elected Chairman of the ESU, overseeing memorable celebrations, including the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the 2022 Gala in the presence of The Princess Royal, Princess Anne. His role as Honorary Consul to New Orleans has

further strengthened his contributions, including securing the British Embassy for the 50th Anniversary of the Luard Morse Scholarship. After 30 years of commitment to the ESU, he is also honored to be listed as one of its current top three individual benefactors.

Dr. Morse is Co-founder of Fairview. Prior to co-founding Fairview, Dr. Morse held positions with TSG Ventures, Equico Capital Corporation and UNC Ventures. Dr. Morse serves on a number of advisory boards of venture capital partnerships



including U.S. Venture Partners (USVP), Battery Ventures, Sierra Ventures and Trinity Ventures. He is a member of the board of directors of Webster Financial Corporation (NYSE: WBS), and a member of the board of trustees of Harris Associates Investment Trust (The Oakmark Mutual Funds). He is currently Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Howard University.

Dr. Morse graduated summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Howard University, having spent his junior year at The London School of Economics and Political Science as an ESU Luard Scholar. He earned M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Princeton University and has been a postdoctoral fellow at Harvard University.

Dr. Morse has been a generous ESU benefactor and champion. From 2003 to 2009 he served on the ESU National Board of Directors. In 2009, on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the Luard Scholarship Program he led a drive to strengthen the program's endowment, himself making a major gift. In gratitude for his generous support of the ESU Luard Scholarship Program, by a resolution of the ESU Board of Directors in September 2012, it was renamed the ESU Luard Morse Scholarship Program. In 2020 Dr. Morse was honored with the ESU Centennial Founder's Award.

Lady Caroline Emma Stanley, Countess of Derby

A lifelong patron of the arts and heritage preservation, Lady Derby is a dear friend of our honoree, Dr. Quinn Peeper, and joins us in celebrating his remarkable contributions to the ESU.

Born into a distinguished British family as the daughter of the 10th Baron Braybrooke, Lady Derby holds

dual honors in History and History of Art from the University of London. Her expertise led her to serve for nearly a decade as Exhibition's Assistant to the Surveyor of The Queen's Pictures at the Royal Collection, working closely with one of the world's most prestigious art collections.

In 1995, she married Edward Stanley, 19th Earl of Derby, and dedicated herself to the restoration of Knowsley Hall, the Stanley family's ancestral estate. Today, Knowsley Hall is an architectural and cultural treasure, known for its extraordinary art collection and historical significance.

Bolormaa Jamiyansuren

Chairperson, ESU Mongolia Chairperson, ESU International Council

Professor Bolormaa Jamiyansuren, a prominent leader with twenty-two years at ESU Mongolia, has been elected Chairperson of the ESU International Council. Her journey began as a National Public Speaking Contest (IPSC) winner in Mongolia, leading to her presentation



at the IPSC in London. She later became the country's first national coach for public speakers. Her extensive leadership includes serving as a Board Member and Chairperson at ESU Mongolia. Outside ESU, she is an economics professor and leads the Mergers & Acquisitions team at a major commercial bank, seamlessly merging academic and corporate expertise.


A North American Tour Journal 1824-25 The Making of a Prime Minister

"We might even in time perhaps have a black President"



The Hon. Edward Stanley by Sir George Hayter


In July 1824, Edward Geoffrey Stanley arrived in New York City at the end of a nearly five-week voyage from Liverpool. The young MP and future 14th earl of Derby was under a cloud before his departure. His political career was off to a rough start and he was in love with a young lady that he was forbidden to marry. A lengthy tour, or as Stanley termed it, a "banishment," had been imposed upon him.

From July 1824 into March 1825, Stanley travelled extensively throughout the eastern half of North America. He crossed mountains and lakes, journeyed up and down rivers, and trekked through pine barrens, swamps, and marshes. He travelled by stage, steamboat, canoe, horseback and sometimes on foot, studying every aspect of the towns and countryside he passed through. Stanley was sometimes surprised, and sometimes shocked, by what he saw. Complicated interactions between the Catholic French and their Protestant British neighbours in Canada, the horrifying lives of those enslaved in the U.S. South, the poverty of Irish immigrants in the north, the degra-

dation of Native Americans everywhere: all of these left deep impressions on Stanley. Everything he learned during this journey shaped his future career as a political reformer and distinguished statesman.



Caroline Derby is a historian, curator and visual storyteller. Born a Neville, she married a Stanley and grew up on the Audley End Estate before studying History and History of Art at London University and then working for nearly a decade in all the royal palaces as Exhibitions Assistant to the Surveyor of The Queen's Paintings of the Royal Collection. She married the 19th Earl of Derby in 1995 and they have 3 children. She is convinced that education and knowledge of history have the power to change lives.

Professor Andrew O'Shaughnessy is Professor of History at the University of Virginia and noted scholar on the American Revolution. He was the former Saunders Director of the Robert H. Smith Center for Jefferson Studies at Monticello and Vice President of the Thomas Jefferson Foundation, Visiting International Fellow at the Wilberforce Institute, University of Hull, and is currently Visiting Fellow at Magdalen College, Oxford.


